The National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls will be in Rankin Inlet, Nunavut

To all families and survivors in Nunavut:

The National Inquiry will have a team consisting of community relations, legal and health in Rankin Inlet, the week of August 14, 2017. The teams will be reaching out to individuals and families in Rankin Inlet who are willing to participate in the National Inquiry.

Rankin Inlet: Tuesday, August 15-17, 2017

The community visit is an opportunity for families and survivors to register to participate in the Inquiry and prepare for the Community Hearing which will take place in Rankin Inlet, the week of December 11, 2017.

The Commissioners' mandate is to examine and report on the systemic causes of all forms of violence against Indigenous women and girls in Canada by looking at patterns and underlying factors.
