The National Inquiry is entirely independent from the federal government and employees are appointed on a term basis. We are committed to having a highly skilled and well represented Indigenous workforce. We strongly encourage candidates to self-identify as belonging to Indigenous peoples.

Key Activities:

Provide a variety of financial services in support of accounting operations. Monitor daily operations using standardized tools, identify bottlenecks and seek continuous efficiencies in the internal processes;

Establish internal processes and procedures in order to comply with the Financial Administrative Acts, policies and directives Recognize internal control deficiencies regarding Account Payables and Account Receivables as well as travel and hospitality claims, and implement appropriate corrective actions as required;

Leads in the development of tools for financial data capturing such as authorities verification tool for funds commitment as per section 32 of the FAA; verification tool of acquisition cards expenditures and travel verification list.

Conduct analysis of information to develop explanations for identified trends, patterns and variances regarding expenses (including travel claims and hospitality).

Participate in the preparation of the semi-annual plan, proactive disclosure and exercise financial delegation authority under section 33 of the Financial Administration Act (FAA).

Coordinate messaging to ensure consistency regarding financial matters.

Provide advice and guidance to clients on a variety of financial topics including Travel, Hospitality, Account payables and Account receivables.
